

<p>Lyme Disease - from deer ticks</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Symptoms: aches, fevers and fatigue • Look for: expanding, bull's-eye rash • Typically: rash appears 2-40 days after bite,. • As the rash grows, the origin fades leaving a ring that resembles a bull's-eye. • If rash present/ tick bite presumed, antibiotic treatment recommended. • Rash develops in only 80% of cases. • Untreated: can lead to arthritis, facial paralysis, meningitis, memory loss and mood changes. 	<p>Weils Desease</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Symptoms: flu-like illness, severe headaches and meningitis jaundice, meningitis, conjunctivitis and kidney failure. • Untreated can lead to death. • If you develop flu like symptoms 3-19 days after contact with contaminated water then you should contact a doctor, explain the circumstances and ask for the Elisa blood test
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
