

The spot where a fort once stood

IT doesn't look much now, but once there was an Iron Age fort on this spot at Mowsbury Camp, Bedford.

Mr. Gerald Dring, a micro-biologist at Unilever, Sharnbrook, who is in charge of the dig, has unearthed a cobbled circle, which is the possible base of an Iron Age hut circle.

With him in the centre of the picture are a party of first-year history students from Bedford College of Education, and one of their lecturers, Mr. Philip Liddle, who is by the fence.

In the background another group are standing where a 12-foot high rampart defended the site. Beyond that was a ditch.

In the distance can be seen Mowsbury Park.
